Dyslexia, also known as **reading disorder**, is characterized by trouble with reading despite normal intelligence.^[1]Different people are affected to varying degrees.^[2] Problems may include difficulties in spelling words, reading quickly,writing words, "sounding out" words in the head, pronouncing words when reading aloud and understanding what one reads.^{[2][3]} Often these difficulties are first noticed at school.^[4] When someone who previously could read loses their ability, it is known as **alexia**.^[2] The difficulties are involuntary and people with this disorder have a normal desire tolearn.^[2]
